ECONOMIC UPDATE

Since our last update, the Senate passed the Coronavirus Aid Relief and Economic Security (CARES) Act (H.R. 748), a \$2 trillion package to respond to the economic and health crises caused by the coronavirus outbreak. The legislation includes an unprecedented injection of loans, grants, and tax incentives for major corporations, non-profit organizations, small businesses, and individuals, among other items. The Senate then adjourned and is expected to be out of session until April 20.

Meanwhile, some House lawmakers are returning to the Capitol, and will meet Friday at 9:00 a.m. to consider the package. The House is expected to have two hours of debate, equally divided on the bill, teeing up a vote at 11:00 a.m. Leader Hoyer said he expects the bill to pass by voice vote. President Trump is expected to sign the bill into law in the immediate hours following House passage. The House is then expected to adjourn for an unspecified time period.

Notably, more than 3 million Americans applied for unemployment benefits last week, according to data released by the Department of Labor this morning. This is the largest number of unemployment claims ever recorded for a single week.

Next week, both chambers will be out of session, but Congressional staff will be working on implementation of the CARES Act and will begin to focus on the Phase IV relief package.

PUBLIC HEALTH UPDATE

Late last night, the Senate overwhelmingly passed a \$2 trillion economic stimulus package by a vote of 96-0. H.R. 748, the *Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act* includes \$100 billion for hospitals and \$150 billion for state and local governments to combat the COVID-19 pandemic, requires health insurers to pay for coronavirus testing, provides new telehealth flexibilities, requires HHS to lead a report on the nation's medical supply chain, allows the use of HSAs for over-the-counter medications, and extends expiring health extenders until November 2020, among other things. Speaker Pelosi has assured quick passage of the bill in the House tomorrow and President Trump has indicated he will sign it into law.

Congressional

- At her weekly [press conference](#), Speaker Pelosi stated she is certain there will be a strong bipartisan vote the House takes up the CARES Act tomorrow. She also noted that while Phase III is about mitigating the economic damage that is being done by COVID-19, Phase IV will be about recovery.
- Majority Leader McConnell [commended](#) the Senate's unanimous passage of the CARES Act.
- Majority Leader Hoyer issued a [Dear Colleague letter](#) informing members the House will convene at 9am tomorrow to consider the CARES Act, with final passage expected by voice vote.

Administration

- In an [interview](#) with The Hill, CDC Principal Deputy Director Dr. Schuchat, warned that we are seeing early signs of outbreaks similar to New York in other parts of the country. She stated, "...we need to take this virus very seriously...we have to be sure that our health care system in diverse geographies is ready for increased burden, and that we have good systems to detect, track, isolate and reduce the spread of continued new cases. I would be very reluctant to let up on measures in

the nation as a whole. There are geographies where the virus hasn't yet arrived in great force but where the health care system needs to be prepared for it."

- In an [interview](#) with National Public Radio (NPR), NIAID Director Dr. Fauci stated "President's Trump has set April 12 an aspirational goal...he's open-minded and flexible to make sure that the facts and the pattern of the virus determine what we do."
