



DAILY COVID-19 UPDATE

May 14, 2020

WHAT HAPPENED TODAY

The House is slated to vote tomorrow on its \$3 trillion coronavirus relief package, the HEROES Act, as well as on a Rule change related to [remote voting](#) and virtual committee proceedings, despite a push for a delay from the Congressional Progressive Caucus and the House GOP whip team formally urging a "no" vote on both the aid bill and the proxy voting plan.

In [remarks](#) on the Senate floor, Majority Leader Mitch McConnell stated the HEROES Act is not a serious proposal, calling it a "catalog of left-wing oddities." He also reiterated the importance of focusing on legal liability protections and nationwide testing so the U.S. can recover from the pandemic.

Notably, President Trump issued an [Executive Order](#) invoking the Defense Production Act to expand the domestic production of critical resources needed to respond to the COVID-19 outbreak, including strengthening relevant supply chains within the U.S. and its territories.

Additionally, the House Energy and Commerce Health Subcommittee held a [hearing](#) today on protecting scientific integrity in the COVID-19 response. Former BARDA Director Dr. Rick Bright warned that without a comprehensive and coordinated national plan based on science, the U.S. faces the "darkest winter in modern history." He expressed concern that the pandemic could "get far worse and be prolonged" if we don't take action before our "window of opportunity" closes.

Moreover, the Trump Administration [announced](#) that firms who received over \$2 million in Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) loans, that do not need them, will be allowed to repay the money without legal consequences, a reversal of an earlier threat of potential criminal prosecution for such actions.

Since our last update, the National Institutes of Health, Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services, and the Small Business Administration published additional guidance. Please see below for more details.

Congressional

- *Senate*
 - Senate Banking Committee Ranking Member Sherrod Brown (D-OH), along with other committee members, [sent a letter](#) to Treasury Secretary Steven Mnuchin and Small Business Administrator Jovita Carranza urging the agencies to provide answers and clarity to small businesses regarding Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) loan amounts.

Congressional

- *House*

- Speaker Pelosi penned a Dear Colleague [letter](#) on the HEROES Act.

- Yesterday, the Select Subcommittee on the Coronavirus Crisis held a [briefing](#) with a bipartisan group of experts on the requirements for safely reopening the nation during the coronavirus pandemic.
- **Senate**
 - Sens. Collins, Shaheen, Smith, and Sinema sent a [letter](#) to CMS Administrator Verma requesting expanded access to vital informational resources that can help Medicare beneficiaries better manage their diabetes during the coronavirus public health crisis.
 - Sens. Tester, Moran, Schatz and Boozman sent a [letter](#) to VA Secretary Wilkie regarding reimbursement for COVID-19-related services.
 - Sens. Duckworth, Collins, and Tester as well as Rep. Underwood introduced bipartisan [legislation](#) to reduce health care costs and ensure parity for Veterans impacted by the COVID19 pandemic.

 - HHS and the Department of Defense [announced](#) a \$138 million contract with ApiJect Systems America for "Project Jumpstart" and "RAPID USA," to expand U.S. production capability for domestically manufactured, medical-grade injection devices starting by October 2020.
