WHAT HAPPENED TODAY

Today, the Federal Reserve Bank of Dallas President Robert Kaplan asserted that a faster economic recovery is predicated on widespread mask usage. Kaplan **stated**, "While monetary and fiscal policy have a key role to play, the primary economic policy from here is broad mask-wearing and good execution of health care protocols."

Yesterday, Speaker Nancy Pelosi (D-CA) pushed back on the Trump Administration's request for a \$1 trillion stimulus cap for additional coronavirus aid. Speaker Pelosi **stated**, "We need a trillion dollars for state and local. We need another trillion dollars for unemployment insurance, and direct payments." The House passed its \$3 trillion stimulus package in mid-May, but it has gained very little support in the Senate.

LATEST STATISTICS

There are a total of **12,376,147** confirmed cases worldwide, 556,895 deaths and 6,794,982 people have recovered.

There are **3,158,183** confirmed cases of the coronavirus in the U.S., 133,777 deaths and 969,111 people have recovered.

The U.S. reported more than 60,500 cases yesterday, setting a single-day record for the sixth time in 10 days.

PUBLIC HEALTH UPDATE

Congressional

HOUSE:

- Rep. Maloney introduced the [**Made in America: Preparation for a Pandemic Act**](#) to secure our nation’s critical stock of PPE and promote a stronger manufacturing base for medical equipment.
- Rep. Keller introduced the [**Reviewing Urban and Rural Adjustments to Level Hospital Expenses and Lopsided Payments Act of 2020**](#), which would require HHS to conduct an evaluation of Medicare reimbursement rates between urban and rural hospitals and make appropriate adjustments.
- Reps. Pallone, Eshoo, and DeGette sent a [**letter**](#) to OMB Acting Director Vought, requesting an explanation for President Trump's decision to withdraw from the World Health Organization during the global COVID-19 pandemic.

SENATE:

- Sens. Van Hollen, Cardin, Warner and Kaine sent a [**letter**](#) to OPM Acting Director Rigas and OMB Acting Director Vought expressing opposition to guidance on bringing federal workers back into offices.
- 32 senators sent a [**letter**](#) to Senate leaders McConnell and Schumer regarding funding for international COVID-19 response.
- Sens. Cassidy and Carper sent a [**letter**](#) to CMS Administrator Verma, calling on the agency to lift regulations that deny insurance coverage for obesity drugs and that limit coverage of Intensive Behavioral Therapy (IBT) amid the COVID-19 pandemic.
- Sen. Cruz issued a [**statement**](#) in response to the Trump administration's decision to withdraw the United States from the World Health Organization.

Administration

CENTERS FOR MEDICARE & MEDICAID SERVICES

- CMS announced the agency's targeted approach to provide additional resources to nursing homes in COVID-19 hotspot areas. Specifically, CMS plans to deploy [**Quality Improvement Organizations**](#) (QIOs) across the country to provide immediate assistance to nursing homes in the hotspot areas as identified by the White House Coronavirus Task Force.

DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES

- HHS, through the Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA), [**announced**](#) approximately \$3 billion in funding to hospitals serving a large percentage of vulnerable populations on thin margins and approximately \$1 billion to specialty rural hospitals, urban hospitals with certain rural Medicare designations, and hospitals in small metropolitan areas.
- HHS made [**May and June COVID-19 Testing Plans**](#) from all states, territories, and localities publicly available on HHS.gov. The State Testing Plans serve as a roadmap for each state's 2019 testing strategy for COVID-19. The plans include details on

response to surge cases and how to reach vulnerable populations including minorities, immunocompromised individuals and older adults.

FOOD AND DRUG ADMINISTRATION

- The FDA is preparing to resume domestic inspections with a new risk assessment system to assist the administration in determining when and where it is safest to conduct prioritized domestic inspections. The [**COVID-19 Advisory Rating system**](#) uses real-time data to qualitatively assess the number of COVID-19 cases in a local area based on state and national data.
- To date, the FDA has authorized 171 tests under EUAs; these include 142 molecular tests, 27 antibody tests, and 2 antigen tests.
