WHAT HAPPENED TODAY

During CNN's State of the Union, Speaker Nancy Pelosi (D-CA) announced that an extension of the boosted \$600 in unemployment benefits must be included in the next coronavirus relief package. The expanded unemployment insurance is set to expire at the end of July and has received major criticisms from congressional Republicans.

Yesterday, HHS Assistant Secretary Brett Giroir stated during an [interview](#) that wearing masks is "absolutely essential" in order to gain "control of the virus." Moreover, Surgeon General Jerome Adams indicated the U.S. can [reverse the surge](#) in COVID-19 cases "in just two or three weeks if we can get a critical mass of people wearing face coverings, practicing at least six feet of social distancing..."

Mike Kelly (R-PA) introduced H.R. 7538, the [**Essential Workforce Parity Act**](#), which would extend paid leave required by the Families First Coronavirus Relief Act (FFCRA) to health care workers and offer liability protections to hospitals and other medical providers from certain lawsuits during the COVID-19 emergency declaration.
