WHAT HAPPENED TODAY

Today, Senate Majority Leader Mitch McConnell (R-KY) stated Democratic Leaders could be "sabotaging" negotiations on the HEALS Act because "they think bipartisan progress for the country would hurt their own political chances." He also criticized Speaker Pelosi for signaling she will reject the GOP's proposal if the additional federal supplemental unemployment benefits are not boosted further, calling her position "unhinged."

In response, Speaker Pelosi called the HEALS Act a "completely inadequate package" that will "only prolong the suffering facing the American people." She urged Leader McConnell to take up the HEROES Act instead in order to "save lives and livelihoods."

The parties remain divided on issues such as total spending on the bill, the liability shield, additional unemployment insurance, funding for state and local

governments, and assistance for renters and homeowners, among other things. Notably, House Majority Leader Steny Hoyer (D-MD) **conceded** that Democrats are willing to agree to a package that does not include the extension of the increased unemployment benefits.

Yesterday, the Federal Reserve ("Fed") held its policymaking meeting in which the committee **announced** it will keep interest rates near zero and warned the economic recovery is highly dependent on the trajectory of the coronavirus.

ECONOMIC UPDATE

Congressional

HOUSE:

- Speaker Nancy Pelosi's (D-CA) **talking points** on, "Republicans' Months-Delayed COVID-19 Proposal Fails Workers and Families, Ignores Science-Based Solutions to Crush Virus and Reopen Economy."
- The House Ways and Means Committee Chairman Richard Neal (D-MA), the House Financial Services Committee Chairwoman Maxine Waters (D-CA), and the House Small Business Committee Chairwoman Nydia Velázquez (D-NY) **urged** Treasury and the Small Business Administration (SBA) to use all means necessary to ensure the remaining Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) loan funds are targeted to minority-owned small businesses.

Administration

FEDERAL RESERVE ("FED"):

- The Federal Reserve **issued** its FOMC statement.
- The Fed **announced** the extensions of its temporary U.S. dollar liquidity swap lines and the temporary repurchase agreement facility for foreign and international monetary authorities through March 31, 2021.

TREASURY:

- Treasury [announced](#) that it has reached an agreement with the United States Postal Service (USPS) on the material terms and conditions of a loan of up to \$10 billion to the USPS under the CARES Act.

INTERNAL REVENUE SERVICE (IRS):

- The IRS [issued final regulations](#) regarding the provision of the Tax Cuts and Jobs Act that limits the deduction for business interest expense, including basic statutory amendments made by the CARES Act.
- The IRS [provided a reminder](#) that the CARES Act can help eligible taxpayers in need by providing favorable tax treatment for withdrawals from retirement plans and IRAs and allowing certain retirement plans to offer expanded loan options.

PUBLIC HEALTH UPDATE

Congressional

HOUSE:

- Speaker Pelosi penned a [Dear Colleague](#) letter on the Senate GOP COVID-19 proposal and ongoing discussions with the Trump administration.

SENATE:

- 13 Senators sent a [letter](#) to Majority Leader McConnell (R-KY), Democratic Leader Schumer (D-NY), Sen. Alexander (R-TN) and Sen. Murray (D-WA) urging the inclusion of commonsense privacy protections for COVID health data in the next coronavirus relief package.
- Sen. Sanders (I-VT) introduced the [Masks for All Act](#), which would use the United States Postal Service to distribute three free, reusable masks to every person in the country, including individuals who are experiencing homelessness or living in group settings such as prisons, shelters, college dorms, and assisted living facilities.

Administration

THE WHITE HOUSE

- The White House provided a [readout](#) from Vice President Pence's Governors briefing on COVID-19 best practices and response.
- The White House released a [fact sheet](#) titled, "President Trump Is Leading a Once-in-a-Generation Effort to Ensure Americans Have Access to a COVID-19 Vaccine."

DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES

- HHS, through the Assistant Secretary for Planning and Evaluation, released a [new report](#) showing the dramatic utilization trends of telehealth services for primary care delivery in Fee-for-Service (FFS) Medicare in the early days of the COVID-19 pandemic. The report analyzes claims data from January through early June.
- HHS, the Department of Energy (DOE), and the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) [announced](#) the formation of the COVID-19 Insights Partnership, an initiative to coordinate and share health data as well as research and expertise to aid in the fight against COVID-19.

NATIONAL INSTITUTES OF HEALTH

FOOD AND DRUG ADMINISTRATION

- The FDA posted a [new template](#) for commercial developers to help them develop and submit emergency use authorization (EUA) requests for COVID-19 diagnostic tests that can be performed entirely at home or in other settings besides a lab, such as offices or schools, and that could be available without a prescription.
- The FDA posted the audio and transcript versions of [Episode 6](#) in its new podcast series, FDA Insight, which features Dr. Peter Marks, Director of the FDA Center for Biologics Evaluation and Research (CBER), in part 2 of a discussion on COVID-19 vaccines.
