WHAT HAPPENED TODAY

Today, President Trump urged Republicans to seek more funding in the next coronavirus relief package. He <u>tweeted</u>, "Go for the much higher numbers Republicans, it all comes back to the USA anyway (one way or another)."

Following the President's tweet, White House Chief of Staff Mark Meadows indicated he is more "optimistic" now that an agreement can be reached on a stimulus bill. He stated that if Speaker Nancy Pelosi (D-CA) is willing to continue negotiations, so are he and Treasury Secretary Mnuchin. Meadows added that in order for a COVID package to pass prior to Election Day, the two parties must make a deal within the next seven to 10 days.

Additionally, Speaker Pelosi and Senate Democratic Leader Chuck Schumer (D-NY) issued a **joint statement** noting they are "encouraged" by the

President's tweet and "look forward to hearing from the President's negotiators that they will finally meet us halfway with a bill..."

Senate Majority Whip John Thune (R-SD) <u>was less</u> <u>receptive</u> to President Trump's tweet, stating the larger the price tag, the harder it will be to gain Republican support. He stated the package will "have to stay within a realistic range if we want to maximize" Republican support.

Notably, the Department of Health and Human Services and the Department of Defense unveiled the Trump administration's COVID-19 <u>vaccine</u> <u>distribution strategy</u>.

HOUSE

• Rep. Ruppersberger (D-MD) <u>introduced</u> federal legislation providing "hero" pay to hospital workers on the frontlines of the COVID-19 pandemic.

SENATE

 Sens. Warren (D-MA) and Cassidy (R-LA) sent a <u>letter</u> to HHS Secretary Azar and Education Secretary DeVos urging the departments to issue new guidance for how schools and colleges should address the "unique mental health challenges" students are facing due to COVID-19.

Administration

DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES

 HHS and the Department of Defense (DoD) <u>released</u> two documents outlining the Trump Administration's detailed strategy to deliver safe and effective COVID-19 vaccine doses to the American people as quickly and reliably as possible.

CENTERS FOR DISEASE CONTROL AND PREVENTION

 CDC <u>released</u> indicators to help schools make dynamic decisions about inperson learning as local conditions evolve throughout the pandemic.

NATIONAL INSTITUTES OF HEALTH

 NIH <u>announced</u> a \$12 million award for outreach and engagement efforts in ethnic and racial minority communities disproportionately affected by the COVID-19 pandemic. The award will support teams in 11 states established as part of the NIH Community Engagement Alliance (CEAL) Against COVID-19 Disparities.

FOOD AND DRUG ADMINISTRATION

FDA <u>published</u> comparative performance data for some authorized COVID-19 molecular diagnostic tests. The tables show the Limit of Detection (LoD) of more than 55 authorized molecular diagnostic COVID-19 tests against a standardized sample panel provided by the FDA.
