WHAT HAPPENED TODAY

Today, President Trump rejected Speaker Nancy Pelosi's (D-CA) \$2.2 trillion coronavirus relief package that the House passed last Thursday.

Trump tweeted that Pelosi is not "negotiating in good faith." He also ordered Treasury Secretary Steven Mnuchin to "stop negotiations until after the election when, immediately after [he] win[s], we will pass a major Stimulus Bill that focuses on hardworking Americans and Small Business." Moreover, President Trump urged Senate Majority Leader Mitch McConnell (R-KY) to focus solely on confirming Supreme Court nominee Amy Coney Barrett.

Speaker Pelosi asserted that President Trump's criticisms and instructions to stop negotiations demonstrate an "unwilling[ness] to crush the virus."

Meanwhile, Federal Reserve Chairman Jerome Powell is urging Congress and the White House to

provide additional fiscal support. Chairman Powell stated, "Even if policy actions ultimately prove to be greater than needed, they will not go to waste." He added the economic recovery will be "stronger and move faster" if more aid is distributed.

Additionally, the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) published briefing documents updating safety standards for COVID-19 vaccine developers. Specifically, the FDA states that vaccine developers will be required to track trial participants for a minimum of two months to rule out safety issues prior to seeking emergency use authorization (EUA). This new requirement almost guarantees that no COVID-19 vaccine could be authorized before the election.
