WHAT HAPPENED TODAY

Today, in an [interview](#) on FOX News, Senate Majority Leader Mitch McConnell (R-KY) noted that Speaker Nancy Pelosi (D-CA) "never made a reasonable offer" on a COVID-19 relief package. McConnell added that while he does believe another stimulus bill is needed, there wasn't time to "get [one] together" due to the upcoming election so they "will reengage" after November 3.

A few hours after President Trump abruptly called off coronavirus aid negotiations yesterday, he [tweeted](#) that "the House and Senate should immediately approve" aid for airlines and a second round of Paycheck Protection loans for small businesses. Trump also [added](#) that if he is sent a standalone bill for a \$1200 stimulus check for Americans, he is "ready to sign now."

Accordingly, Treasury Secretary Steven Mnuchin attempted to broker a deal with Speaker Pelosi to save the airline industry. However, Pelosi told Mnuchin he should "go read" an airline rescue bill that House Democrats tried to advance last week "so that they could have an informed conversation" on providing additional support.

- The SEC voted to propose a new limited, conditional exemption for finders assisting small businesses with capital raising.

PUBLIC HEALTH UPDATE

Congressional

HOUSE

- Speaker Nancy Pelosi (D-CA) penned a Dear Colleague letter following President Trump calling off bipartisan coronavirus negotiations.
- House Majority Leader Steny Hoyer (D-MD), Del. Eleanor Holmes Norton (D-DC), and Reps. Jamie Raskin (D-MD) and Don Beyer (D-VA) issued a statement demanding that the White House assist with local contact tracing efforts in the wake of the COVID-19 outbreak within the White House.

SENATE

- Sens. Patty Murray (D-WA) and Chuck Schumer (D-NY) sent a letter to White House chief of staff Mark Meadows regarding the COVID-19 super-spreader event that occurred at the White House complex.

Administration

THE WHITE HOUSE

- The White House released a memorandum from the president's physician.

DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES

- HHS released guidance for COVID-19 hospital reporting and FAQs for hospitals, hospital laboratories, and acute care facility data reporting.

CENTERS FOR DISEASE CONTROL AND PREVENTION

- CDC published a Morbidity and Mortality Weekly Report (MMWR) titled, "Trends in COVID-19 Incidence After Implementation of Mitigation Measures-Arizona, January 22 - August 7, 2020."

NATIONAL INSTITUTES OF HEALTH

- NIH, working in collaboration with the Biomedical Advanced Research and Development Authority (BARDA), announced a third round of contract awards for scale-up and manufacturing of new COVID-19 testing technologies. The six new Rapid Acceleration of Diagnostics (RADx) initiative contracts total \$98.35 million for point-of-care and other novel test approaches that provide new modes of sample collection, processing and return of results.

FOOD AND DRUG ADMINISTRATION

- The FDA launched a new webpage at www.fda.gov/covid19vaccines to highlight new information as it becomes available.
- As of today, 271 tests are authorized by FDA under EUAs; these include 214 molecular tests, 52 antibody tests, and 5 antigen tests.
