



## DAILY COVID-19 UPDATE

October 9, 2020

### WHAT HAPPENED TODAY

Today, White House Economic Adviser Larry Kudlow indicated that President Trump has approved a revised \$1.8 trillion stimulus bill that he and Treasury Secretary Steven Mnuchin plan to offer Speaker Nancy Pelosi (D-CA). While this is larger than last week's \$1.6 trillion offer from the White House, there is no indication that Speaker Pelosi will be open to supporting a package with a price tag less than \$2.2 trillion.

Earlier this morning, Trump tweeted, "Covid relief negotiations are moving along. Go Big!" President Trump also stated he would "like to see a bigger stimulus package than...either the Democrats or the Republicans are offering."

Meanwhile, Senate Majority Leader Mitch McConnell (R-KY) said a deal on a coronavirus relief package is "unlikely in the next three weeks." He added that

even if a deal is reached, "the first item of priority in the Senate is the Supreme Court."

Additionally, the federal deficit for 2020 **has hit a record high** of \$3.1 trillion, well over double the highest deficit on record. The record deficit can be, in part, attributed to the increase in federal aid spending to combat the COVID-19 pandemic.

# PUBLIC HEALTH UPDATE

## *Congressional*

### HOUSE

- Speaker Nancy Pelosi (D-CA) [penned](#) a Dear Colleague letter outlining the ways in which the HEROES Act would "crush" the coronavirus utilizing science-based strategies.
- Rep. Krishnamoorthi (D-IL) sent a [letter](#) to HHS Secretary Azar seeking information on reported plans by HHS and CMS to impose penalties—the loss of Medicare and Medicaid funding—against hospitals that do not satisfactorily comply with new COVID-19 reporting requirements.
- Rep. Neal (D-MA) sent a [letter](#) to HHS Secretary Azar regarding COVID-19 vaccine accessibility.

## *Administration*

### CENTERS FOR MEDICARE & MEDICAID SERVICES

- CMS [announced](#) amended terms for the \$106 billion in payments to providers and suppliers issued under the Accelerated and Advance Payment (AAP) Program during the COVID-19 public health emergency. Under the Continuing Appropriations Act, 2021 and Other Extensions Act, repayment will now begin one year from the issuance date of each provider or supplier's accelerated or advance payment.

### NATIONAL INSTITUTES OF HEALTH

- The National Cancer Institute (NCI) has launched the [Serological Sciences Network for COVID-19 \(SeroNet\)](#), an initiative aimed at quickly increasing the nation's antibody testing capacity and engaging the U.S. research community to understand the immune response to COVID-19.
- A [clinical trial](#) to test the safety, tolerability and efficacy of a combination treatment regimen for coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19) consisting of the antiviral remdesivir plus a highly concentrated solution of antibodies that neutralize SARS-CoV-2, the virus that causes COVID-19, has begun. The study is taking place in hospitalized adults with COVID-19 in the United States, Mexico and 16 other countries on five continents.

### FOOD AND DRUG ADMINISTRATION

- FDA updated the dashboard on the [Coronavirus Treatment Acceleration Program](#) (CTAP) webpage. As of September 30, 2020, 550+ drug development programs were in planning stages, 350+ trials were reviewed by FDA and 5 COVID-19 treatments were currently authorized for emergency use.

### CENTERS FOR DISEASE CONTROL AND PREVENTION

- CDC [updated](#) their website to reflect recent data supporting increased risk of severe illness from the virus that causes COVID-19 among adults with coronavirus who are obese, overweight, or who smoke or have a history of smoking.
