WHAT HAPPENED TODAY

Today, Speaker Nancy Pelosi (D-CA) and Senate Democratic Leader Chuck Schumer (D-NY) held a joint press conference to push for an additional multi-trillion dollar relief package. Citing President-elect Joe Biden's election win and surging COVID-19 cases, Pelosi and Schumer stated President Trump's refusal to accept the election results is "making it even harder to address the massive health and economic crisis."

In response to their remarks, Senate Majority Leader Mitch McConnell (R-KY) rejected their call for a larger relief bill. He indicated that the "level at which the economy is improving further underscores" the appropriateness of a \$500 billion relief package. He added that Pelosi and Schumer's proposal is "not a place...we're willing to go." However, McConnell did reiterate his support for another relief package.

Additionally, NIAID Director Dr. Anthony Fauci expressed optimism that the coronavirus pandemic will not last "a lot longer" as a result of the vaccines that are currently under development.

However, he warned it is unlikely we will be able to eradicate COVID-19, adding "it may... become endemic."

Dr. Michael Osterholm, a member of President-elect Biden's newly formed coronavirus advisory board, floated the idea of a **four to six week nationwide lockdown** to drive down the numbers of COVID-19 infections and hospitalizations and revive the economy. Dr. Osterholm suggested that the federal government "...could pay for a package right now to cover all of the lost wages for individual workers...companies...city, state, county governments."

ECONOMIC UPDATE

Administration

FEDERAL RESERVE ("FED")

- During a webinar hosted by the European Central Bank, Federal Reserve Chairman Jerome Powell stated the U.S. economy will likely need further support from Congress and the Fed even if the coronavirus vaccine becomes available by the end of the year.

TREASURY

- Treasury released its **Monthly Treasury Statement** which shows the federal deficit for October reached \$284 billion, over double the deficit from last October.

PUBLIC HEALTH UPDATE

Congressional

HOUSE

- Speaker Pelosi's (D-CA) office provided a [**readout**](#) of President-elect Biden's call with Congressional leaders, during which they spoke about COVID-19 and the economic impact the pandemic has had on this country.

SENATE

- Senate Majority Leader McConnell (R-KY) delivered [**remarks**](#) on the Senate floor regarding the recent COVID-19 vaccine announcement. He also urged Americans to continue wearing masks, social distancing, etc. McConnell stated, "This virus is not going to magically leave us alone if we decide we are fed up with taking precautions."

CENTERS FOR MEDICARE & MEDICAID SERVICES

- CMS [**announced**](#) that as of November 10, Medicare beneficiaries can receive coverage of monoclonal antibodies to treat COVID-19 with no cost-sharing during the public health emergency. CMS' coverage of monoclonal antibody infusions applies to bamlanivimab, which received an emergency use authorization (EUA) from the FDA earlier this week.

CENTERS FOR DISEASE CONTROL AND PREVENTION

NATIONAL INSTITUTES OF HEALTH

- COVID-19 treatments for people with [**early infection**](#) are needed urgently, according to a JAMA Viewpoint article by NIAID Director Dr. Anthony Fauci and colleagues. Treating people early in the course of infection with SARS-CoV-2, would speed their recovery, reduce the likelihood that they develop severe outcomes and reduce demand on the healthcare system, they write.

FOOD AND DRUG ADMINISTRATION

- Today, the FDA hosted a virtual [**FDA Grand Rounds: Facial Coverings During the COVID-19 Pandemic: How well do they flatten the curve?**](#) This presentation provided an overview of the agency's research to evaluate the ability of facial coverings to reduce the spread of infection and how the FDA is

developing a comprehensive risk-assessment tool to predict the probability of infection with individuals wearing a non-surgical face mask or face covering.
