January 7, 2021

WHAT HAPPENED TODAY

Today, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) released [\\$22 billion](#) -- the first tranche of funding to states for COVID-19 vaccine distribution and testing appropriated by the *Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act*. \$3 billion will be awarded to facilitate vaccine distribution, while the remaining \$19 billion will be allocated for testing and contact tracing.

Notably, a study conducted by the CDC found that of the 1.9 million people who received a COVID-19 vaccine during the first two weeks of distribution, 21 experienced a severe allergic reaction. In a news briefing yesterday, Nancy Messonnier, the Director of the CDC's National Center for Immunization and Respiratory Diseases, stated the two authorized vaccines are "very safe" and that severe allergic reactions are "[still a rare outcome](#)." As such, she urged Americans, especially seniors, to get vaccinated as soon as they are eligible to do so.

Additionally, the Small Business Administration and Treasury issued updated guidance late last night regarding the Paycheck Protection Program (PPP).

TREASURY

- The Department of Treasury [launched](#) the \$25 billion Emergency Rental Assistance Program (ERAP) established by the Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2021.
- Treasury and the IRS [started to send](#) approximately 8 million Economic Impact Payments (EIPs) by prepaid debit card.

SMALL BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION (SBA)

- The SBA [issued guidance](#) on accessing capital for minority, underserved, veteran, and women-owned businesses during the COVID-19 pandemic.

PUBLIC HEALTH UPDATE

DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES

- HHS announced the extension of the Community Based Testing Site program for COVID-19 testing, through partnership with national pharmacy and retail chains CVS, Rite-Aid, Walgreens, Quest (through services at Walmart) and service provider eTrueNorth (through services at Health Mart and Topco locations). The partnership has resulted in establishing more than 3,300 COVID-19 testing locations in all 50 states, the District of Columbia, and Puerto Rico. To date, more than 5.6 million tests have been conducted as a result of this partnership.

CENTERS FOR DISEASE CONTROL AND PREVENTION

- The CDC announced it will be providing more than \$22 billion in funding to states, localities and territories in support of the nation's response to the COVID-19 pandemic. Funding will provide critical support for testing and vaccination-related activities to jurisdictions before January 19, 2021.
- The CDC issued guidance titled, "Establishment and Management of Public Health Rapid Response Teams for Disease Outbreaks: COVID-19 Disease Supplement."
