WHAT HAPPENED TODAY

Today, President Joe Biden will sign an Executive Order (EO) aimed at delivering additional economic relief for households and businesses that are continuing to face financial hardship during the COVID-19 pandemic. According to a [fact sheet](#) released by the White House, the EO will launch an all-of-government approach to "provide equitable emergency economic relief to working families, communities, and small businesses across the nation."

The EO will include expanded federal nutrition assistance programs; ensure equitable and effective delivery of economic impact payments; request a pause on federal collections on overpayments and debts for veterans; clarify that workers who do not return to "unsafe working conditions" continue to qualify for unemployment insurance; and establish an interagency benefit coordination structure.

National Economic Council Director Brian Deese indicated that President Biden's impending EO will "provide immediate relief to hard hit families," but "these actions are not a substitute for comprehensive

legislative relief." Deese added the Biden Administration will still engage with Congress to work on passing President Biden's \$1.9 trillion stimulus package. Within the coming days, Deese plans to discuss the proposal with a 16-member bipartisan group of senators.

Sen. Susan Collins (R-ME), a member of the bipartisan group, expressed skepticism in regards to President Biden's coronavirus relief package. She stated, "It's hard for me to see when we just passed \$900 billion of assistance why we would have a package that big now." However, Sen. Collins did note that the potential for additional aid could become evident in the coming months.

Notably, NIAID Director Dr. Anthony Fauci told CNN that a lack of truthfulness from the Trump Administration regarding the COVID-19 pandemic "very likely" cost lives and prevented Americans from trusting medical and scientific information conveyed by health officials.

Congressional

HOUSE

- Rep. Lauren Boebert (R-CO) [**introduced**](#) the *No Mask Mandates Act*. The bill would allow for masks to be encouraged but not mandated when people are on federal property or engaging in interstate commerce.
- Reps. Ted Budd (R-NC) and Mike Garcia (R-CA) [**introduced**](#) the *Vaccinate More Americans Act*. The bill would allow vaccine providers to administer leftover COVID-19 vaccines to individuals eligible to receive the vaccine in the following phased allocation group, instead of letting the doses go to waste.

SENATE

- Sen. Tina Smith (D-MN) sent a [**letter**](#) to President Joe Biden and Vice President Kamala Harris, calling on them to work with Congress to ensure COVID-19 vaccines are free for all Americans.

NATIONAL INSTITUTES OF HEALTH

- In a large NIH clinical trial conducted worldwide, full dose anti-coagulation (blood thinner) treatments given to moderately ill patients hospitalized for COVID-19 [**reduced**](#) the requirement of vital organ support—such as the need for ventilation. A trend in possible reduction of mortality was also observed and is being further studied.
