WHAT HAPPENED TODAY

Today, Senate Majority Leader Chuck Schumer (D-NY) and Speaker Nancy Pelosi (D-CA) announced Democrats will move forward with the budget reconciliation process to pass additional COVID-related aid. In floor remarks, Leader Schumer stated the Senate will act "as early as next week" to begin the process of considering a "very strong COVID-19 relief bill." Both Democratic leaders emphasized their willingness to proceed regardless of GOP support.

In order to pass a stimulus relief bill, Democrats will need their entire caucus to vote in favor of budget reconciliation. Senator Joe Manchin (D-WV) has consistently reiterated his opposition to President Biden's \$1.9 trillion proposal, but yesterday he sidestepped reporters' questions asking if he would vote for the budget resolution. Senator Manchin only conceded that Democrats are "doing everything we can to make sure Joe Biden [is] successful."

Additionally, in a phase 3 global clinical trial, the single-shot Johnson & Johnson coronavirus vaccine was found to have **66% efficacy** in preventing moderate to serious disease. Notably, the

pharmaceutical company says the vaccine is 85% effective against severe disease and 100% effective against preventing hospitalization and death, 28 days after inoculation. In comparison, both the Pfizer and Moderna two-shot vaccines are 95% effective.

Congressional

HOUSE

- Reps. Ann Kuster (D-NH) and Larry Bucshon (R-IN) **introduced** bipartisan legislation to bolster and quicken the nationwide COVID-19 vaccine rollout. *The Immunization Infrastructure Modernization Act*, would improve and expand information-sharing between state and federal governments, as well as public and private health care providers, to ensure vaccines are being administered effectively and efficiently across all states and territories.
- Rep. Lauren Underwood (D-IL) sent a **letter** to President Joe Biden urging him to prioritize public health investments in response to COVID-19, expand access to affordable health care, and advance evidence-based maternal health equity policies in the president's annual budget.

Administration

DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES

- In accordance with the Executive Order issued yesterday by President Biden, HHS **announced** a Special Enrollment Period (SEP) for individuals and families for Marketplace coverage in response to the COVID-19 Public Health Emergency. This SEP will allow individuals and families in states with Marketplaces served by the HealthCare.gov platform to enroll in 2021 health insurance coverage from February 15, 2021 through May 15, 2021.

CENTERS FOR MEDICARE & MEDICAID SERVICES

- CMS **issued** a fact sheet on the 2021 Special Enrollment Period in response to the COVID-19 Public Health Emergency.

NATIONAL INSTITUTES OF HEALTH

- According to NIH, an investigational COVID-19 vaccine **developed** by Janssen Pharmaceuticals appears to be safe and effective at preventing moderate and severe COVID-19 in adults, according to an interim analysis of Phase 3 clinical data conducted Jan. 21. The vaccine, called Ad.26.COV2.S or JNJ-78436725, requires only a single injection and can be stored in a refrigerator for months.

FOOD AND DRUG ADMINISTRATION

- FDA **issued** guidance to provide a policy to help expand the availability of coagulation systems for measurement of whole blood viscoelastic properties that are used to assess hemostasis, for the duration of the COVID-19 public health emergency.

CENTERS FOR DISEASE CONTROL AND PREVENTION

- CDC **released** a Morbidity and Mortality Weekly Report titled, "Allergic Reactions Including Anaphylaxis After Receipt of the First Dose of Moderna COVID-19 Vaccine — United States, December 21, 2020–January 10, 2021."
- CDC **posted** a webpage on implementing a workplace vaccination program and reopening the workplace.
- CDC **posted** a webpage providing detailed information about the requirement for proof of negative COVID-19 test or recovery from COVID-19 for all airline passengers arriving in the U.S.
