



## DAILY COVID-19 UPDATE

April 13, 2021

### WHAT HAPPENED TODAY

Today, the Food and Drug Administration and Centers for Disease Control and Prevention made a joint decision to pause the administration of the Johnson & Johnson COVID-19 vaccine after six women between the ages of 18-48 developed blood clots six to 13 days after vaccination. The six cases occurred among more than 6.8 million people in the U.S. who have received Johnson & Johnson's vaccine to date.

Jeff Zients, White House COVID-19 Response Coordinator, assured Americans that this will not impact the vaccination effort in the U.S. He noted, "We have more than enough supply of the Pfizer and Moderna vaccines to continue the current pace of 3 million shots per day."

This evening, the House will convene to consider the Senate's amended version of H.R. 1868, which would postpone the 2% Medicare sequester payment cuts through the end of the year. The measure no longer includes language waiving the PAYGO rules. In the meantime, the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid
